Materials

- Worsted weight yarn in black, white, and yellow
- 3.5mm crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Polyester fiberfill

Abbreviations

- sc: single crochet

- dc: double crochet
- inc: increase (2 sc in the same stitch)
- dec: decrease (sc 2 stitches together)
- sl st: slip stitch
- ch: chain
- hdc: half double crochet

Pattern

Body:

1. **Round 1:** 6 sc in a magic circle. (6)
2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each sc. (12)
3. **Round 3:** (sc, inc) x6. (18)
4. **Round 4:** (sc, inc) x9. (27)
5. **Round 5:** sc in each sc. (27)
6. **Round 6:** (sc, dec) x9. (18)
7. **Round 7:** (sc, dec) x6. (12)
8. **Round 8:** sc in each sc. (12)
9. **Round 9:** (sc, dec) x6. (6)
10. Tie off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Head:

1. **Round 1:** 6 sc in a magic circle. (6)
2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each sc. (12)
3. **Round 3:** (sc, inc) x6. (18)
4. **Round 4:** (sc, inc) x9. (27)
5. **Round 5:** sc in each sc. (27)
6. **Round 6:** (sc, dec) x9. (18)
7. **Round 7:** (sc, dec) x6. (12)
8. **Round 8:** sc in each sc. (12)
9. **Round 9:** (sc, dec) x6. (6)
10. Tie off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Beret:

1. **Round 1:** 6 sc in a magic circle. (6)
2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each sc. (12)
3. **Round 3:** (sc, inc) x6. (18)
4. **Round 4:** sc in each sc. (18)
5. **Round 5:** (sc, dec) x6. (12)
6. Tie off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Wings: (make 2)

1. **Round 1:** 6 sc in a magic circle. (6)

2. **Round 2:** (sc, inc) x3. (9)
3. **Round 3:** (sc, dec) x3. (6)
4. Tie off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Assembly:

1. Sew the body and head together.
2. Sew the beret to the top of the head.
3. Sew the wings to the sides of the body.
4. Embroider or glue on eyes and a beak.
5. Stuff the penguin with polyester fiberfill.

Your penguin is now complete! Enjoy your new cuddly friend.



Tips

- Use a smaller crochet hook for a tighter stitch and a denser amigurumi.
- Use a larger crochet hook for a looser stitch and a less dense amigurumi.
- Add a keychain to the top of the beret to make a cute keychain.

- Make a whole family of penguins by crocheting penguins of different sizes.
- Get creative and add your own personal touches to the penguin, such as a scarf, hat, or other accessories.

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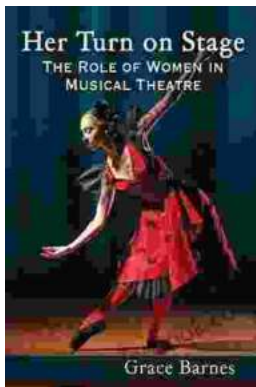
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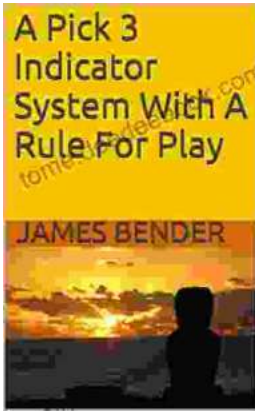
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
