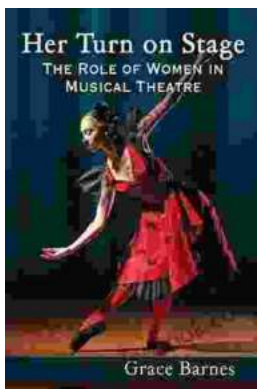
cutter and mat. A rotary cutter is a sharp, circular blade that is mounted on a handle. The mat is a thick, self-healing surface



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
